## **Speakers:**

### **Kemê Pellicer**

Kemê is a member of Critical Friend's and an artist and cultural agent from Helsinki Finland. The members of Critical Friend's are artists with a multicultural background and the aim is bringing in expertise multicultural artists sit on and included their experiences and assessments into the development of the network.

### **Nadia Abraham**

Nadia is the founder and artistic director of the Faroe Islands International Minority Film Festival (FIMFF). Her career began in theatre, studying in Gothenburg and New York. Her love for films, and activism through art, eventually lead her to leading her own festival. Being Faroese/Palestinian she saw an underrepresentation of minority groups, such as the LGBTQIA and QTPOC community, and wanted to make a change, debuting September 2017. The aim of the festival is to build a bridge between minorities and marginalised groups in the Nordic region and the rest of the world. We believe in social change and the celebration of diversity through cinema by creating a forum for dialogue through film and art about queer, trans, and people of color.

### **Oddbjørn Hansen**

Oddbjørn Hansen is a senior librarian at the Norwegian National Library and works at The Multilingual Library section with acquisition and cataloging of languages like Polish, Bosnian and Romanian. Oddbjørn is chairing FlerKult, Norsk Biblioteksforenings special interest group, tasked with promoting multicultural library services in Norwegian libraries, and is a standing committee member of IFLA's Library Services to Multicultural Populations Section.

### **Marit Vestlie**

Marit is a senior adviser at the National Library Norway. She is a librarian with a wide range of responsibilities in the library community. Currently she works as a project manager for The Nordic Library Project, funded by The Nordic Ministry of Culture and organized and run by the National libraries in Denmark, Norway and Sweden. The National Library of Norway coordinates the project.

The International Library (IB) in Sweden, the Multilingual Library (DFB) in Norway (a division of The National Library of Norway), and the Danish Library Centre for Integration (part of the Royal Danish Library) represent the three Nordic partners.

The project is an initiative to improve digital library services for Nordic immigrant communities in the Nordic countries. The project focuses on digital books and aims

to expand existing library services developed over the past three decades. The main objective is to improve and expand digital library services to linguistic minorities in the Nordic countries. The project's effort to establish a supply of electronic books targets five languages: Arabic, Persian, Tigrinya, Somali and Croatian.
